Who am I?: I am a 54 year old pastor's daughter who married a mission bound preacher boy from Baptist Bible College 30 years ago. While serving in South Africa both my husband and I took the Precept upon Precept Leader Training Course where we learned the Inductive Method of Bible Study and how to teach it to others. Studying God's Word with an inductive method has greatly deepened my understanding of the Bible. That's what this workshop is about today, so lets get started!

Inductive Bible Study

Step 1: Pray! Ask God to help you focus and have a clear understanding of His Word as He uses the Holy Spirit to teach you as you study.

Step 2: Read and reread the passage. We're going to work on Colossians 3:12-17

Step 3: Consider the type of literature, the context, and to whom it was written.

Types of literature include: Historical—Genesis, Exodus, 1&2 Samuel, Acts; Biographical—Luke; Poetic—Psalms; Proverbial—Proverbs, James; Prophetic—Isaiah, Revelation; Didactic—Romans (teaching); & Epistles—Galatians, Philippians; or a book could be a combination of these genres.

Colossians is an epistle, a letter from Paul to the church that he started in Colosse. So as we read it we should keep in mind the original text was written to inform or teach the believers as a Pastor, mentor, and spiritual parent would communicate with a beloved student.

Colossians 3

1 If then you were raised with Christ, <u>seek</u> those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. 2 <u>Set your mind on things above</u>, not on things on the earth. 3 For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. 4 When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory.

5 Therefore <u>put to death</u> your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. 6 Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, 7 in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them.

8 But now you yourselves are to <u>put off</u> all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. 9 Do not lie to one another, since you have <u>put off</u> the old man with his deeds, 10 and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, 11 where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all.

12 Therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, put on tender mercies, kindness, humility, meekness, longsuffering; 13 bearing with one another, and forgiving one another, if anyone has a complaint against another; even as Christ forgave you, so you also must do. 14 But above all these things put on love, which is the bond of perfection. 15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. 17 And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him.
